SCHOOL or COLLEGE TEACHER

Teaching the national curriculum and running the school orchestra, choir, or rock band in school Teaching assistant roles, including emerging roles of highlevel teaching assistants, taking classes under the supervision of a qualified teacher Part-time college lecturer, teaching A level and HND music technology subjects

Most performers and composers are involved in teaching at some stage of their career, some to support their other musical income, others with a vocation as a teacher. There is a large demand for music teachers at the moment.

The Government want every primary school student to have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument.

Youth Music want to see a substantial increase in music leaders, who have undergone some professional development.

There is a need for teachers with special skills, for example, in DJ techniques, rap and hip hop.

People have wanted to learn how to play instruments, how to read and write notation, how to compose songs and music for hundreds of years and there's no sign of it ending yet!
